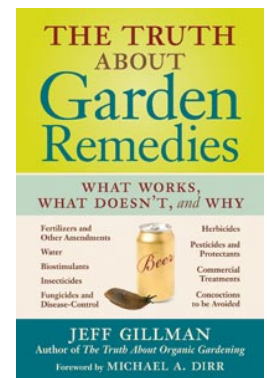
Featuring:

Jeff Gillman was raised in Southeastern Pennsylvania where he attended Franklin and Marshall College. After college Jeff received a Masters degree in entomology and a Ph.D. in horticulture from the University of Georgia. He is currently an Associate Professor in the Department of Horticultural Science at the University of Minnesota and has written three books including *The Truth About Garden Remedies*, *The Truth About Organic Gardening*, and *How Trees Die*.

Jeff's two presentations will focus of his most popular books: *The Truth About Garden Remedies* and *The Truth About Organic Gardening*. He will take a closer look at garden remedies that work and do not work, focusing on the most important question of why. Jeff will also investigate both good and bad organic practices while paying attention to why these practices are or are not a good idea.

Lynn grew up in Shawano, Wisconsin, where she spent many enjoyable hours hiking and camping in the north woods. She has a Bachelor of Science in natural resources from the University of Wisconsin and a master's degree in horticulture with a minor in agricultural journalism from the University of Minnesota. She is the author and photographer of

*Landscaping with Native Plants of Wisconsin*, the first book designed to identify Wisconsin's native plants and plant communities and to demonstrate how to use them effectively in a typical home landscape. For 15 years she was the editor of *Northern Gardener* magazine, the official publication of the Minnesota State Horticultural Society.



Lynn will talk about the benefits of using native plants in gardens and landscapes and bust some of the myths about these plants. Her presentation will provide examples of successful native-plant landscapes as well as introduce you to some lesser-known natives that are suitable for garden use.
